

School of Education Department Meeting Friday, October 8, 2021 10:00 a.m. via Zoom

Approval of September 10, 2021 minutes: JoAnne Devine moved to accept the minutes as distributed. Regina Miller seconded the motion. The motion carried and the minutes of the September 10, 2021 department meeting were approved as distributed and placed on Document Manager.

QEP: Special Guest Speaker Dr. Gus Cameron gave an update on QEP and onsite visit from SACS.

- Transdisciplinary Communication is the theme.
- New creative capstone course, IDS 2891, Creative Capstone, for AA degree. Non-gen ed course. Any student can take as an elective. All students entering in Fall 2022, this will be a degree requirement to graduate. Pilot sections will begin spring 2022. All offered in blended modality. Embedded librarian in every section as a resource. Applications to teach course due date was yesterday, they will train 10 in spring 2022 and 10 in the fall of 2022. Encourage faculty in all Schools to apply to teach.

Civic Litereacy:

It is expected (late October 2021) that the Florida Legislature will pass a statute that all AA students and baccalaureate students with a Fall 2021 catalog or later will need to pass AMH 2020 or POS 2041 and pass the FCLE (a social studies test) in order to graduate with their credential.

It is expected that AS students will have this requirement for next year.

A section of AMH 2020 has been created for the Fall 2021 Mini B-Term for those AA students that need this requirement can take it to finish off their degree. The FCLE is expected to be offered by the Testing department in November 2021 to aid these AA students as well.

Committee Updates:

Curriculum Committee: Julia Kroeker was excused from the meeting and she sent the following report: The last meeting had a very short agenda. Discussed the process of making reviewing the proposals easier for the Committee.

Learning Assessment Committee: Caroline Seefchak reported:
