Summary		

Due to a lack of field site options, faculty propose reducing the clinical credit hours associated with this course from 2 to 1 (from 90 to 45 clinical hours) with a corresponding faculty load reduction from 6 to 3 hours for clinicals. [Didactic portion of course = 2 CR with 2 CR faculty load; no change.] Total course credit hours thus decrease from 4 to 3; faculty load decreases from 8 to 5. No change in course learning objectives.

Because time in the specialty units is limited, field placement hours are supplemented with clinical simulations. This credit reduction must be in place for Fall 2023 to meet the Florida Board of Nursing rule that no more than 50% of clinical hours be obtained in simulations. The 1-credit, 45-hour clinical aligns with FSW's other two NUR specialty courses (Pediatric NUR and Mental Health NUR) and is recognized practice across the country.

1.	Will this reduction in clinical hours put students at a disadvantage compared to graduates of similar programs in the state?
	No – 1 credit/45 hours is standard practice in FSW's clinicals and across the country.
2.	How will the credit/clinical hours decrease affect students' ability to meet course learning objectives? Are there specific learning goals or criteria that must be met within clinical hours that will need to be revisited?
	No effect. Learning objectives will be met within the combination of field training and supplementary simulations. Only the relative time spent in each modality changes.
3.	Does this change affect the course mapping to the state Frameworks for the ASN program? No; no change in CLOs or matching to program outcomes.
4.	If students fail this course, what is the plan for remediation? Course credits decrease from 4 to 3, so current students who need to retake the course after Summer 2023 will be one credit short for graduation. Registrar's comments in Curriculog express this concern for students under the 2022-2023 catalog.
	Students who fail will retake the (new) course for 3 credits (2 didactic and 1 clinical, reduced from 2). They will also be required to take an additional 1-credit course (to be created) that will specify completion of an additional 45 clinical hours, as required by their catalog.
	[NUR 2244L Independent Study (3 credits) was mentioned as a possible existing course, but it is not listed for variable credits (1-3 CR) and is specified as Advanced Clinical Nursing (MedSurg) so would not be appropriate for Maternity.]
	CC requested that the NUR program complete a New Course Proposal for a 1-credit Independent Study course, to be presented at the March meeting in conjunction with the current proposal for NUR 2420C. It may be preferable to write this as a variable credit, generic IS course that could be used for various purposes, including as a supplement to courses whose credits undergo change.
	Dr. McClinton notes that a separate syllabus would not be required for this course (if it is written as an adjunct to an existing course). When applicable, the course syllabus would be attached to the student's degree audit noting the exception.

- 1. Please provide more detail on the reason for the proposed credit increase in the Justification field, and specific coverage that is lacking. No changes have been proposed to course description, topic outline, or CLOs that correspond to increased material coverage.
 - Course credit structure was changed 2 years ago. Why does it need to be changed again?
 - Will material be added to account for the 1-credit increase? How with these additional 15 hours/semester be filled?
 - Will this require a change in topic outline, course description, or CLOs?
 - If changing CLOs, will this impact the Course Map to FL Frameworks for this program?

Fall 2022 was the first time this course was offered for 3 credits, as part of the latest AS NUR reconfiguration. In retrospect, the decision to decrease this course to 3 credits of didactic appears to have been a miscalculation given the importance of this foundational course.

This course covers unique material that is not repeated in other courses, including exploration of whole systems from beginning to end. Although all learning objectives have been covered at a shallow level, faculty must supplement with video lectures, which do not allow students to interact or ask questions of the instructor. Adding a credit to didactic will allow class time for deeper coverage across the board.

2. Is it possible to cover the "missing" material/CLOs in another course, rather than increasing the credits on this one? Could Adult Health Nursing II pick up the material?

A large amount of material is covered in this course, which provides the foundation for understanding whole systems from beginning to end. This material is not repeated in other courses. Adult Nursing II builds on this course.

Increased coverage is necessary to prepare students to progress in the NUR AS program by passing end-of-course tests. "New generation format" end-of-course tests are being implemented in April 2023, which this course cannot support at 3 credits. The program needs to increase the didactic credits in this course now to serve current students who will take the course next year. This will also better prepare students to pass the NCLEX-RN exam for licensure to practice at the end of the program.

3. After the change, how will the course structure and credits compare to other FL schools? Will our students be taking more credits than those at other schools?

Nursing faculty and administration made in-depth comparisons using national and state norms before proposing these curricular changes. Increasing the didactic portion of the course to 4 credits aligns with Nursing AS programs across the country, most of which are 4-5 credits.

4. If any students in the current cohort fail this course, what is the plan for retakes? According to their catalog year, they would only need 5 credits, only 3 of which would be didactic and 2 clinical. With combined credits, they will need to retake both didactic and clinical, right? How will this work?

The current cohort will take this course in Fall 2023 at the new credit level with the increased coverage. They will have an additional credit toward degree. This will be offset by a decrease of 1 credit in NUR 2420C.

Course description: Added "pending site guidelines" to supervision clauses. Removed requirement for those currently employed in a related field to seek a residency that will provide a different experience.				
Residency hours: Decreasing required residency experience from 125 to 100 hours because students were having difficulty completing 125 residency hours in mini semester. Full semester course will replace mini semester, but course credits and faculty load remain the same. To fulfill the required hours, students will meet weekly with the clinical coordinator to discuss residency experiences, write reflection papers, and complete a final project and presentation. Faculty load				

does not change. The program coordinator teaches 9 credit hours, holds weekly Zoom meetings with students in residencies, and completes site visits.

Prerequisites: Change from 'completion of 29 core credits plus 9 track credits' to 5 specific courses that will provide sufficient preparation to begin a residency in the 3rd year. Other programs in state allow students to start residency in 3rd semester with a similar set of prerequisites. The proposed prerequisites cover foundational topics to begin residencies (e.g., substance abuse, conflicts and crises, talking to clients, interviews, assessments, group work). Moving residency to the third semester will facilitate the course repeatability option (2x, up to 9 credits) that is already in place for students who would like to explore more than one residency.

"Other" course objectives: Deleted list numbering, standards from state Frameworks, and first objective, which was repeated from the GE Competency-supporting objectives.

The *total clinical hours required toward degree* is not specified on the catalog page. Did you want to add this?

Please explain or delete: "the recommendation is to replace it with Capstone to meet the 60 credit hours needed."

3. Learning Objectives: In learning objective that begins, "Portray..." recommend adding punctuation to clarify clauses.

Learning objective that begins, "Understand..." – recommend selecting a higher-level Bloom's taxonomy verb that will facilitate assessment.

4. Repeatability: Is the repeatability status mentioned on the syllabus encoded in Banner? (2x, up to 9 credits toward degree). Does this information need to appear on the course catalog page or program page somewhere?

Summary

Proposed changes will modernize and streamline the S&HS, AS curriculum by 1) removing lowenrollment, redundant, and outdated courses; 2) adding relevant General Education courses that meet the program learning outcomes required by State Frameworks; and add flexibility by 3) replacing Specialty Tracks with Electives options. Courses required to earn the Human Services Generalist CCC are now imbedded within AS Program Requirements. The new Elective groups allow students to complete an additional, related CCC or other courses of their choice.

Courses added to Program Requirements: PSY 2012, CLP 1001, CLP 2140, SYG 1000, IDS 2891. HUS 2315 becomes optional to allow SLS 1515 to fit within the 60 required credits toward the AS. Changes will allow students to complete the program in 2 years while meeting the same state Program Frameworks.

Electives (9 credits) replaces Specialty Tracks. To complete the AS degree, students may take any three additional 3-credit courses, or the 3 remaining courses required to earn the Addiction Services CCC, or the 3 remaining courses required to earn the Youth Development CCC. This allows students more choices and flexibility.

HUS 2842L *Counseling Residency I* moved from tracks to Program Requirements.

In a related Course Change Proposal for HUS 2842L, the prerequisite sequence is revised to replace a large block of HUS-specific requirements with the 5 non-HUS courses listed above under Program Requirements. This will allow students to take their first residency in their 3rd semester, with the possibility of up to two more residencies in the fourth semester. Changes will allow students to complete the program in 2 years while meeting the same state Program Frameworks.

The Fall 2023 effective date was requested to bring the course into compliance asap; Dr. Bilsky approved.					
A New Course Proposal for RET 1485 has been submitted for the same meeting (see next item). Assuming the NCP is approved, students currently enrolled in the Respiratory Care, AS program who do not pass this first-year course by the end of Summer 2023 would be required to take the replacement course, RET 1485, next year.
